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Benefit Survey Update

In last month's Wire we reported that ENMAX was undertaking a benefit survey. This article drew a sharp response from Human Resources, but did result in pension questions being added to the survey. Unfortunately, the pension questions combined both the defined benefit and defined contribution plans, so it will be impossible to determine which plan the members prefer. Why would ENMAX choose not to obtain this information if they were truly interested in meeting employee's needs?

While our focus in last month's article was to inform you of the survey, it is important that you know that ENMAX is falling behind the Calgary Labour Market when it comes to Health and Dental benefits. Local 38 has raised this matter during benefit oversight committee meetings in 2013 and 2014. On both occasions the reply was that a study needs to be done to confirm where the industry was regarding benefits.

With the late timing of this survey and with the requirement to establish cost and benefit levels so members can make their selection in mid-June, it is safe to say we will not see the changes this year.

All of this leads us to believe the current survey is far more about reallocating existing dollars than improving benefit levels.

The dollar value of the dental and LTD benefits have been eroded by ten years of inflation. The need to improve benefits, not just reallocate dollars has become increasingly apparent. Enmax needs to understand this and to seriously address the increasing deficiencies.

Calgary Crush!

In an amazing election upset, the Alberta New Democrats swept the majority of Calgary seats, and have formed the new majority government in Alberta. In the initial opening of the election in Calgary, Joe Ceci was the acknowledged front runner in Calgary Fort. Joe represented many Calgary Fort communities as an Alderman for 15 years, and is widely respected throughout the riding. At the outset, Joe was considered to be a star candidate, set to make a breakthrough in Calgary for the New Democrats.

In the end, Joe took half the vote in Fort. With significant experience in elected office, Joe is best positioned to represent members of Calgary Fort in the Legislature.

What is surprising to many was the overwhelming support of Calgarians for the New Democrats. It became apparent late in the election period that frustration and anger of Calgarians towards the governing Conservatives was reaching a boiling point. The result is that over a dozen NDP MLAs will now be joining Joe in the Legislature to represent Calgary in the new majority government.

This election victory is a tribute to the New Democrats and their clear message that it is time for change in Alberta. Support for the New Democrats spanned the entire province, with NDP MLAs heading to the Legislature from Medicine Hat, Lethbridge, Red Deer, Peace River, Hinton, Banff, Calgary and Edmonton.
