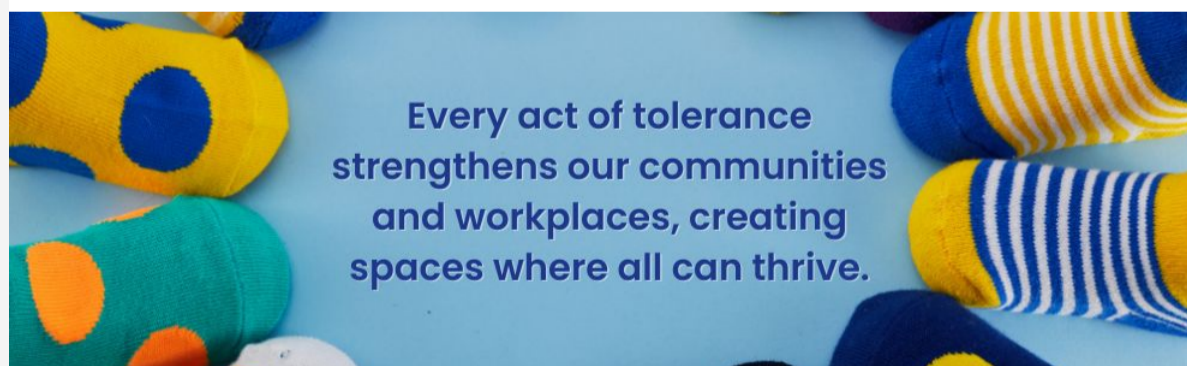
Promote Open Dialogue and Celebrate Diversity
